Introduction and Welcome

Welcome to the first Health Improvement Resource Service (HIRS) e-newsletter – we plan to produce 3 newsletters per year to keep you up to date with developments within the service.

The headline news for HIRS is that the library has now moved from Stirling Community Hospital (SCH) to a new home at NHS Forth Valley's Central Supplies Department (CSD), Colquhoun Street, Stirling. This space is larger for the library which will make it easier for clients to view the wide range of resources on offer. It also means that all HIRS staff will be based together once again.

Those of you who have been registered with HIRS for a few years will remember 'Open Access Sessions'. These are being relaunched as Look 'n' Book Sessions and will allow clients to come along to the library without an appointment. Session times are given later in the newsletter.

Other new developments are themed events and displays linking in with the seasons and campaign calender.

Statistics

Statistics

HIRS stocks over 2300 individual resource items on health improvement related topics which are available either to borrow, or for distribution, to our 1386 registered clients.

Of these items, 409 are leaflet and poster titles or condoms which we distribute, by request, to our registered clients.

In the financial year 2012-13, HIRS dispatched 795 orders of leaflets and posters, consisting of a total of 164,151 items, and 102 condom orders consisting of 70,693 condoms.

And so far, in this financial year, figures are showing a healthy potential:

The HIRS Library stocks over 1900 borrowable resources, consisting of books, DVDs, teaching packs and display models which clients can pre-book.

In financial year 2012-13, loans and loan renewals averaged around 100 per month and the first few months of this year are presently showing discernable growth:

Ordering Processes

Reminder of Ordering Process

A reminder of the wide range of resources available to HIRS clients:

- Borrowable resources i.e. books, DVDs, models, games and teaching kits. Examples include models of smokey lungs, a full size plastic skeleton, drugs box with mock examples of what illegal drugs look like, condom demonstrators and healthy eating plate game
- Leaflets and posters on a wide range of health topic areas
- Sexual health consumables e.g. condoms, femidoms, dams and lubricant

Generally leaflet orders have a maximum cap of 40 of any one leaflet and 3 of any one poster per order, although some are less. If you are having a large event and require more of a particular publication please contact us and we may be able to support your request.

HIRS commit to dispatching your complete order (NHS only) or have your order ready for collection within 10 working days of receiving your order however it is usually quicker than this. Registered clients can complete an order form and return it by:






