Blood Glucose Meters

We are currently switching over blood glucose meters for patients with type 2 diabetes. Patients currently on TRUEyou meters will move over to 4SURE smart meters as there has been some advances in technology and TRUEyou will no longer be marketed after May 2020.

The switch is being facilitated by Nipro (distributors of 4SURE) throughout GP practices in Forth Valley and started at the beginning of September.

This will affect the type of blood glucose strips and lancets that you keep in stock in your pharmacy and once a patient is switched they will need to use the 4SURE smart strips and 4SURE Lancets.

Did you know that a patients Community Health Index number (CHI number) consists of a 6 digit Date of Birth (DDMMYY) followed by a 3 digit sequence number and a check digit. The ninth digit is always even for females and odd for males.





Out Of Stocks

A flowchart has been produced by NHS Forth Valley to assist community pharmacies in managing supply problems and additional advice is also available in a Community Pharmacy Scotland guidance document which explains the usage of appropriate endorsements to avoid the need for a new prescription.

Both documents and local advice on specific products are available on the supply bulletins section of the community pharmacy website.

MCR/Serial Prescriptions
