- Staff should be tested TWICE weekly and the test takes 5 minutes with results in 30 minutes.

Allied Health Professional with Independent Prescriber Qualification

Community pharmacy teams are reminded that as described in PCA(P)(2020)25 Updated Information on Prescription Stationery and Allied Health Professionals who are Independent Prescribers they may be presented with GP10 (SS) prescription that appears to have been issued by a General Practitioner however the medication has been prescribed by a paramedic independent prescriber who is responsible for the signing of their name in the prescriber signature area. You will be able to identify the prescribers name, role and their HCPC professional code by way of a stamp added to the bottom of the prescription near the signature
