Community Pharmacy Applicants

- Lead will issue:
- copy of local Pharmacy First Plus SLA
 - application for prescriber code
 - Once prescriber code is issued prescription pads will be ordered.

Primary Care Applicants

- Lead will issue documentation and advice on EMIS workaround*
- Documentation on EMIS Workaround will be provided by Lead.
 - PIP Stamp will be provided **by the employer.**
 - **Line Manager** to organise EMIS Training on workaround (Training via eHealth)
 - **Practice manager** to set up PIP as user on EMIS (contact Janet Binnie)**
 - **PIP** to ensure correct EMIS READ coding used and correct script annotation / stamp

Acute/Community Hospital Applicants

Inpatients - Complete HePMA module to permit HePMA prescribing .

Outpatients - Liaise with Prescribing Lead to organise Prescriber Code for HBP pad or Hospital Prescription Outpatient Pad for urgent / hospital only medications
